



The 'St Patrick's Sporting Creed' is read at the beginning of each carnival by a family before the baton is passed to the next nominated family. The 'Shrine', a heritage listed building on the grounds of St Patrick's School, was built in 1916 to pay homage to local Allora Families who had lost loved ones during World War 1. The family names of Hughes, Lynam and Rynne are represented in the Shrine and are also the names of our sporting teams.
